## **Don't Miss Out on the Witte Museum's *The Genius of Leonardo: Machines in Motion* Ending Soon**

SAN ANTONIO--*Have you mastered all of Leonardo da Vinci's inventions?* There are only six weeks left to see the United States debut of *The Genius of Leonardo: Machines in Motion* at the Witte Museum in the Kathleen and Curtis Gunn Gallery. This exhibit has already attracted more than **36,000** visitors since its opening on June 21. Come explore all of Leonardo da Vinci's inventions in this interactive exhibit featuring 40 life-sized and operational machines constructed from in-depth studies of Leonardo's designs. Also included in this exhibit is Leonardo's Workshop, filled with hands-on activities such as studying flight, building a bridge, building a dome, drawing in perspective and launching a catapult.

The last **Summer Adventure Club** coinciding with *The Genius of Leonardo* exhibit is **Machines in Motion** August 4– 8 for children entering grades 3 - 5. Share in the genius of Leonardo da Vinci and draw up ideas inspired by Leonardo's machines, test wings for flight, create a helicopter and design a gizmo with simple machines. The Witte Museum Summer Adventure Club sessions are from 9 a.m.–5 p.m. The cost per week is \$180 for museum members and \$230 for non-members.
