Internship Summary:

This internship will provide the interested party with a general understanding of collections care and management, registration methods, and museum best practices. The intern will be focused on two projects working on backlogged incoming acquisitions and museum deaccessioning. The intern will obtain thorough knowledge of the museum accession and deaccession procedures and practices. The intern will be someone who wishes to gain insight into registration and collections work within a museum setting.

Summary of Responsibilities:

Typical tasks include assisting the Collections Team with the following:

- Create an inventory of backlogged acquisitions
- Research accessioned and deaccessioned objects within the Collections records
- Catalogue backlogged accessions as needed including creating condition reports
- Create records using the collection management database, Re:Discovery Proficio
- Assist with other projects, such as exhibition installation or deinstallation, as needed

Required Qualifications:

- Enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program at an accredited institution in museum studies, history, anthropology, or related field.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- Exhibit attention to detail, precision in execution of work, and critical thinking skills.
- Ability to work independently or collaboratively with others.
- Interested in or has an understanding of museum best practices and standards.
- Understanding of collection management databases, particularly Re:Discovery Proficio.
