Internship Summary:

This internship will provide a professional experience to advance strategic initiatives that culminate into the reimagining of the Texas History exhibits. The intern will gain hands-on and eyes-on experience with curatorial work and collection management for the Witte's Texas History Collection. Under the supervision of the Vice President of Collections and the Witte's Curators, the intern will assist to improve the stewardship of the collection through rehousing, cataloguing, curation, and enhanced collection management. The intern will be someone who has an understanding of Texas or American history and/or material culture and wishes to gain insight into collections work within a museum setting.

Summary of Responsibilities:

- Unpack Texas History artifacts, identify, and assess condition.
- Determine any conservation or cleaning needs, under the guidance of supervisors.
- Capture catalogue information as well as digital images of each object.
- Update object records in the collections management database Re:Discovery Proficio.

Required Qualifications:

- Enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program at an accredited institution in museum studies, history, anthropology, or related field.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- Exhibit attention to detail, precision in execution of work, and critical thinking skills.
- Ability to work independently or collaboratively with others.
- Interested in or has an understanding of museum best practices and standards.
- Understanding of collection management databases, particularly Re:Discovery Proficio.
