About the Witte:

Internship Summary:

This internship will provide hands-on and eyes-on experience with collection management and rehousing of the Witte's Texas History Collection. Under the supervision of the Vice President of Collections and the Witte's Collections Team, the intern will assist with a grant-funded project to improve collection stewardship through rehousing, cataloguing, and assessment. The intern will be someone who has an understanding of Texas or American history and/or material culture and wishes to gain insight into collections management work within a museum setting.

Summary of Responsibilities:

- Create storage solutions and mounts for Texas History artifacts, under guidance of supervisors.
- Unpack Texas History artifacts, identify, and assess condition.
- Capture catalogue information as well as digital images of each object.
- Determine any conservation or cleaning needs, under guidance of supervisors.
- Update object records in the collections management database Re:Discovery Proficio.

Required Qualifications:

- Enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program at an accredited institution in museum studies, history, anthropology, or related field.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- Exhibit attention to detail, precision in execution of work, and critical thinking skills.
- Ability to work independently or collaboratively with others.
- Interested in or has an understanding of museum best practices and standards.
- Understanding of collection management databases, particularly Re:Discovery Proficio.
